#### **Make Your Opinion Count**

The **National Research Council** (NRC) is undertaking research as part of the <u>Aging in Place Challenge program</u>. This initiative aims to enhance the quality of life for older adults and their caregivers by fostering innovation for safe and healthy aging, shaping strategies that support aging in place, and guiding the design of technology.

As part of this program, a team of researchers is conducting a survey to understand seniors' barriers and challenges in the adoption and acceptance of smart and assistive technologies. They are looking for a diverse, nationally representative group of individuals residing in Canada, who are aged 60 and above, as well as those who support them in their daily lives, such as caregivers or family members.

The survey will take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete. As a token of appreciation, at the end of the survey, the participants can enter their name into a draw for one of forty \$100 gift cards.
